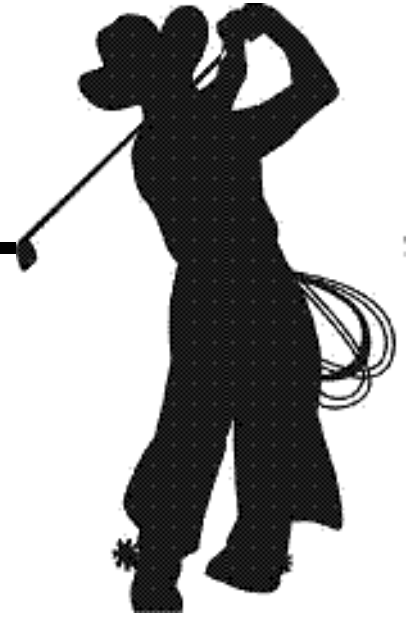

This August, KNITTING HANDS/PRAYERFUL HEARTS celebrated its one year anniversary. Begun last year under the direction of Sr. Joan, 30+ knitters have taken part with an average weekly attendance of fifteen to twenty. Thanks to the generosity of parishioners and others we have had no shortage of yarn.

In the past year members have knitted or crocheted 57 afghans/lap-ropes, 39 adult winter hats, 30 adult chemo hats, 18 scarves, 22 baby sweaters, hats and booties, and 29 baby blankets.

The beautiful items have been donated to: Jesus, Mary and Joseph Home; Siena House, Golden Age, Santa Cruz rest home; VA Hospital; homeless shelter; Watsonville farm workers; a local oncologist; and Dominican Hospital.

The group meets weekly in the Hall on Wednesdays from noon to two. Members enjoy the camaraderie and sense of purpose as we create items and pray for those who will receive them as well as for each other.
